We successfully launched our first high school Bigs program, first mentors, in Milton - setting the stage for more successful programs throughout our communities.

We will also partner with other youth-serving organizations like churches and after-school programs. We will support our strong current community and site-based matches while enhancing ways for matches to engage with each other.

We will be hosting monthly activities for all families involved with Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Central Wisconsin: Bigs and their families, Littles and their families, and families in the process of being matched. These events will be in communities throughout our service area. Our 1:1 model is unique, but our future success will be in how we partner with like-minded organizations to deliver our 1:1 model in new and different ways. We have seen the success of the above efforts and will continue as part of ENGAGE to seek out additional opportunities to help support youth and their families facing adversity.




Meet Sean (Little) and Cole (Big)


JANUARY - NATIONAL MENTORING MONTH
